English

History

Music

Science In Science this term, our job will be to study

animals, including humans. We will focus more

on what animals eat, and classifying

carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We will

continue our longitudinal study comparing

how a tree changes across the seasons.

We will be continuing to use the scheme Charanga and we will be exploring different styles of music. Our topic this half term is called 'In the Groove'.

We will be exploring different textiles, and experimenting with ways to join them. We will also make collages.

Art

We will develop our multi-skills knowledge as we focus on throwing and catching different sized objects.

Maths

We will be learning about number bonds, and how we can apply our previous knowledge of numbers to our teens numbers. We will have a focus on problem solving, as well as telling the time to the hour. We will also link our counting in 2s skills to thinking about doubles and halves.

Design and Technology
